Bethel Heights 2002 Willamette Valley Pinot Noir

This is our house antidote to the recession blues. We selected our most immediately appealing, forwardly fruity Pinot noir barrels of the vintage and blended them into a wine that can be enjoyed while it's young, saving us all the time of cellaring and giving plenty of immediate gratification. Or, for those who are trying to assemble a cellar on a budget, this wine will continue to improve for the next five to seven years.


Oregon's 2002 vintage

In many ways the 2002 vintage was quite similar to 2001. Bloom in mid-June under sunny skies set a large crop that had to be thinned aggressively. Sunny and unusually dry weather persisted through the summer. Harvest took place in early October with no sign of rain

Winemaker notes: This Willamette Valley Pinot noir blend includes fruit from all the vineyards in the Valley from which we source grapes. The largest contributor is our own Estate vineyard, and it is quite a selection this time: all our best blocks are there, including the Southeast, West, and Flat Blocks, with the largest percentage coming from our South Block.

Production for the vintage was limited, both by nature, and more importantly, by rigorous thinning early in the growing season. The most structured wines we have made since 1999, this first release of the 2002 Pinot noirs from Bethel Heights has the power for a long period of development in the bottle if you are patient, or provides the forward fruit that will complement tonight's dinner. Enjoy this classic vintage.
